CIRCULAR LETTER
NUMBER 10925, YEAR 2020

***CONCERNING: CONTROL OF PORTS OF ENTRY TO BALI REGION AND THE ESCALATION OF COVID-19
MANAGEMENT***

Based on the fourth circular letter on the escalation of COVID-19 management, the Governor of Bali has proposed an official letter to the Minister of Transportation of the Republic of Indonesia, Number : 550/3563/Dishub, dated on May 18th, 2020 about : control of ports of entry to Bali Region.

Minister of Transportation of the Republic of Indonesia has approved the Bali Governor's letter/ proposal through an official letter issued through Directorate General of air transportation, NUMBER : Um.101/0002/DRJU.KSIHU-2020, dated on May 20th, 2020 pertaining : PCR Health protocol requirements at I Gusti Ngurah Rai International Airport, Bali and through official letter of the Directorate General of sea transportation NUMBER : Um.002/39/18/OJPL/2020, dated May 22nd, 2020 pertaining : PCR protocol requirements at port.

Based on the concerns above, the Government of Bali Province applied an official letter to control the ports of entry points to Bali and escalation of COVID-19 management with some points stated below:

1. The Province of Bali limits the passengers entering the Bali Province and has made some exceptions for the following :
 - a. For people who works in government institutions or private sectors with the following purposes :
 - 1.) Involved in COVID-19 escalation task force
 - 2.) Involved in defense, security and public order services
 - 3.) Health services
 - 4.) Basic needs services
 - 5.) Basic needs support services
 - 6.) Prime economic industry services

- b. Medical reason; patient requiring emergency medical treatment.
 - c. People with specific personal matter having the core family member (in this case parents, husband / wife, children, sibling) suffer from serious illness or pass away.
 - d. Indonesian immigrant worker, Indonesian citizens, and Indonesian students abroad as well as deportation act with certain purposes to their country of origin.
2. I Gusti Ngurah Rai International Airport to implement strict control of the passengers:
 - a. Permitting only passengers with a negative result of swab test with Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) based issued by **authorized government hospitals or laboratory** assigned for COVID-19.
 - b. Official report/letter with negative result of COVID-19 issued by authorized government hospitals or laboratory with validation maximum of 7 days when entering Bali.
3. All sea ports in Bali to implement strict control on the passengers:
 - a. Permitting only passengers with a negative result of swab test with Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) based issued by **authorized government hospitals, public health offices, or any other authorized institution** assigned for COVID-19.
 - b. Official report/ letter with negative result of COVID-19 issued by authorized government hospitals or laboratory with validation maximum of 7 days when entering Bali.
4. To the Head of Management from each airline company scheduled for arrivals in I Gusti Ngurah Rai airport, must appoint a special officer to do the verification on:
 - a. The presence of the passenger's letter of examination with swab tests (PCR) with non-reactive/negative result when purchasing flight ticket.
 - b. The passenger who plan to enter Bali's territory through airfreight has filled in the application form, which can be access through <https://cekdiri.baliprov.go.id> and are able to show the QR Code to the verification officer.
5. To the Head of Management of each freight transport by sea company, related and or managing the Bali island ports of entry, must appoint a special officer to do the verification on:
 - a. The presence of the passenger's letter of examination with swab tests (PCR) with non-reactive/negative result when purchasing travel ticket.

- b. The passenger who plan to enter Bali's territory through waterborne transport has filled in the application form, which can be access through <https://cekdiri.baliprov.go.id> and are able to show the QR Code to the verification officer.
6. For those who travel to Bali through airport and seaport but not categorized as passengers mentioned in point number 1 of this letter, will be required to do a self-quarantine once arriving at the final destination in Bali for the remaining of days valid since the previous rapid test result. They will also be required to do the second Rapid Test.
7. The local security officers a Balinese administrative village to continue with the verification and supervision of public activity as well as travelling activity to control the spread of COVID-19 and must be in coordination with COVID-19 task force in the village.
8. To the Regents/Mayors in all of Bali to facilitate and share information to the public through either printed or electronic form on the travel restrictions to enter or exit the Bali region to minimise the spread of COVID-19.
9. This notification letter is valid from 28 May 2020 until there will be a new notification related to COVID-19 is issued.
